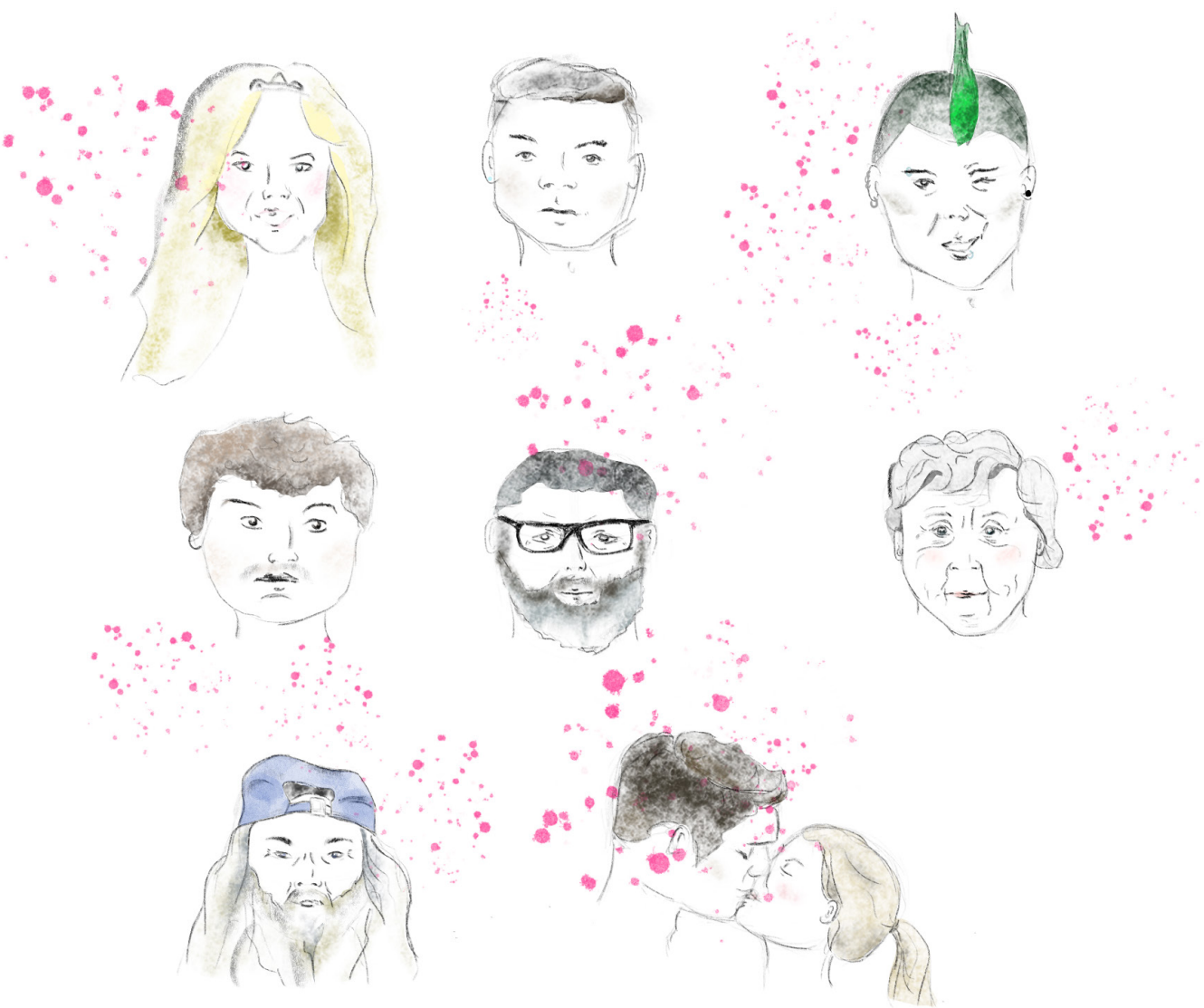

It is not only known for its beauty but also for its diversity in visitors.



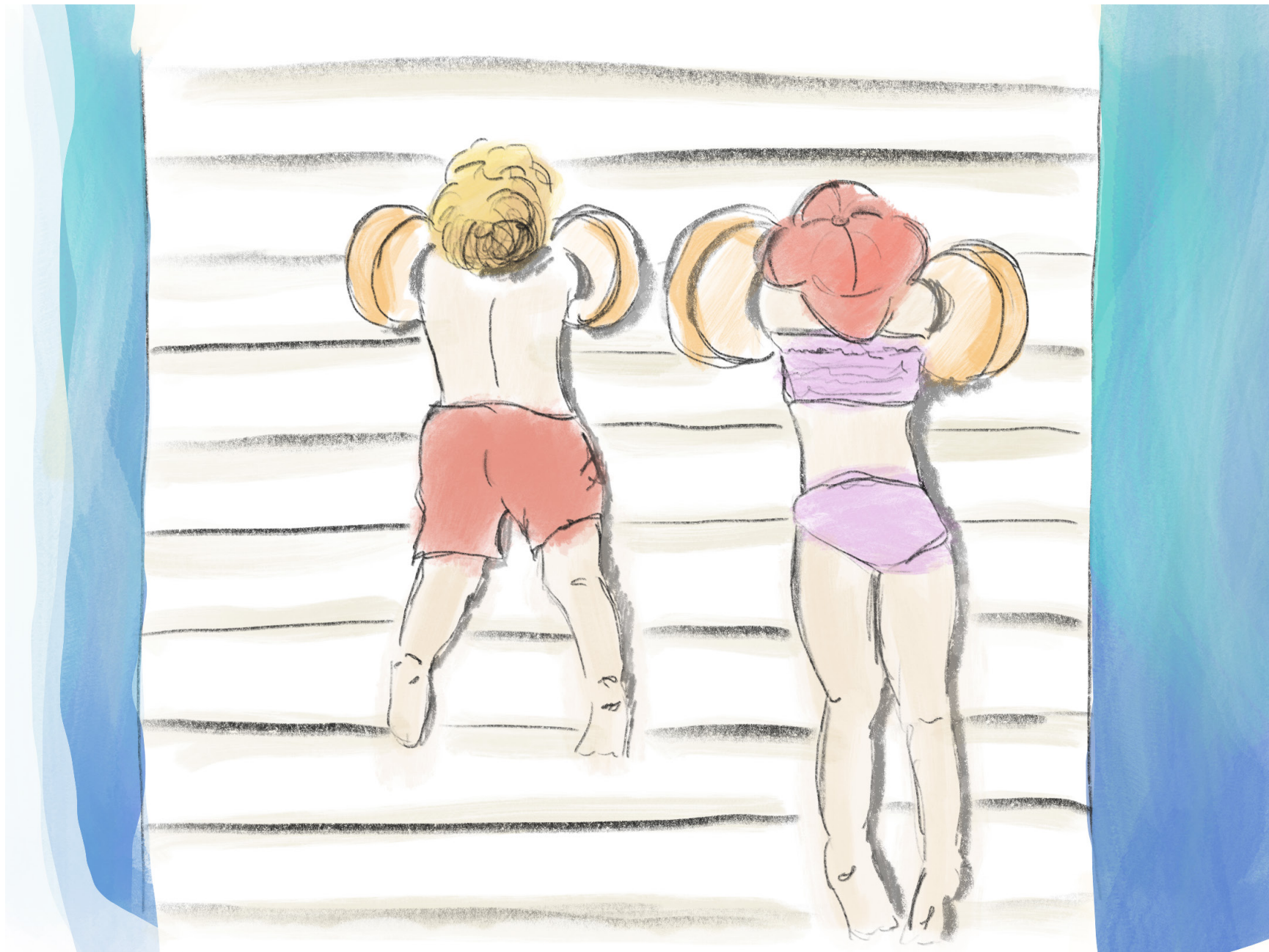


With less and less places to go while Corona,

the virus.

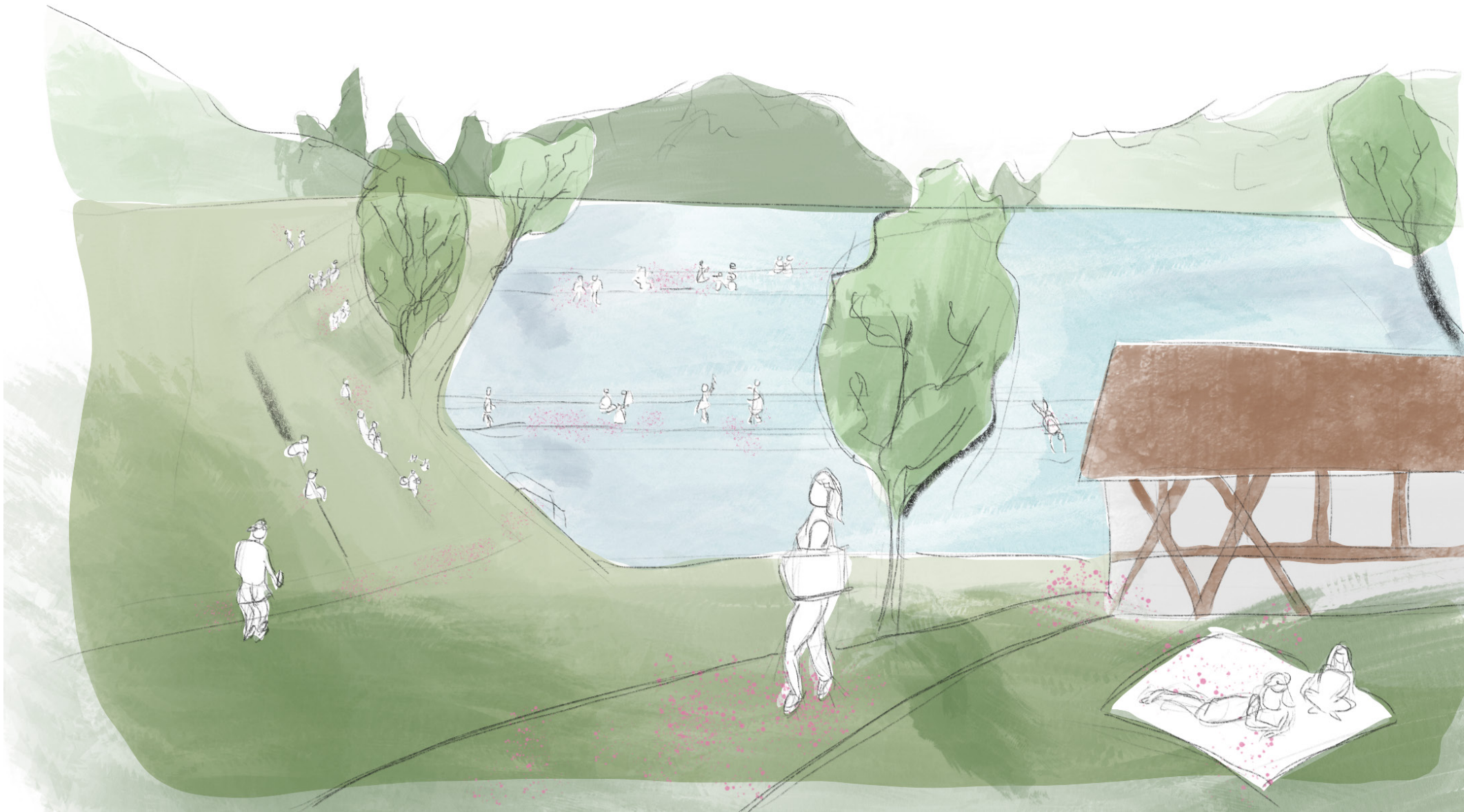
This was especially a problem on the first day the lockdown rule allowing only a restricted number of people to gather, has been gradually lifted to 30 people.

the criminal police

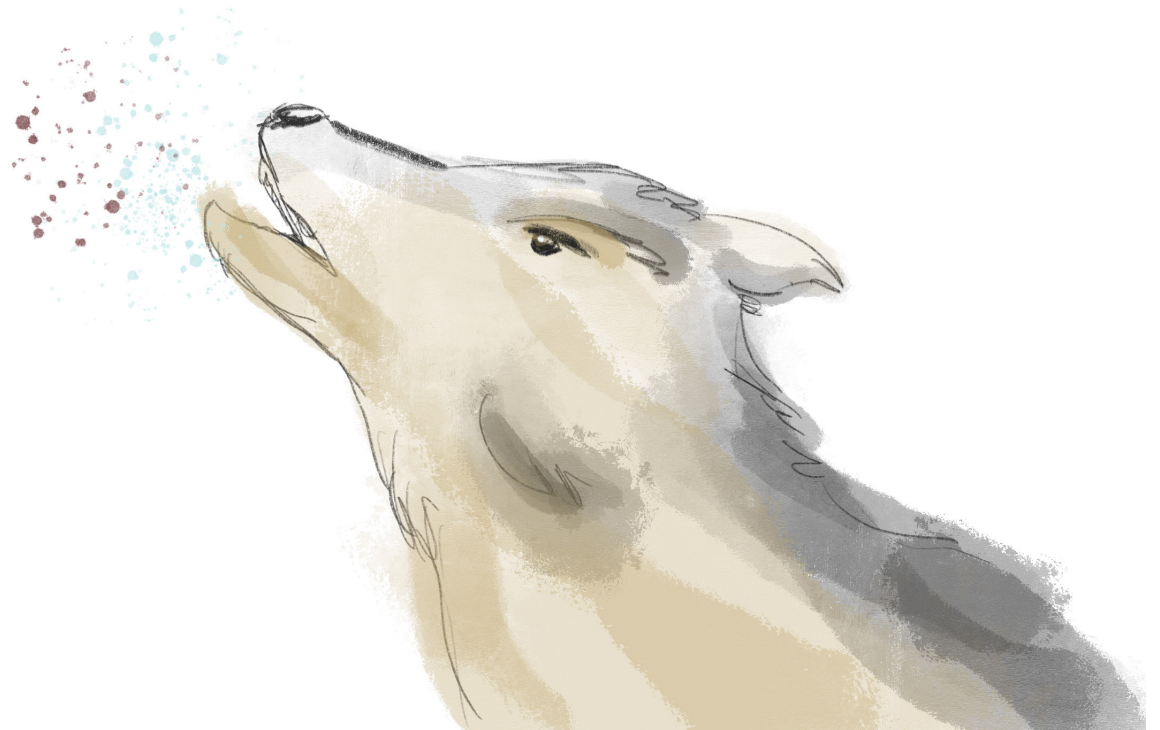
From the other side of the pond you could see white flashlights and hear the people shouting.

and be present in the now, in the more enjoyable times.

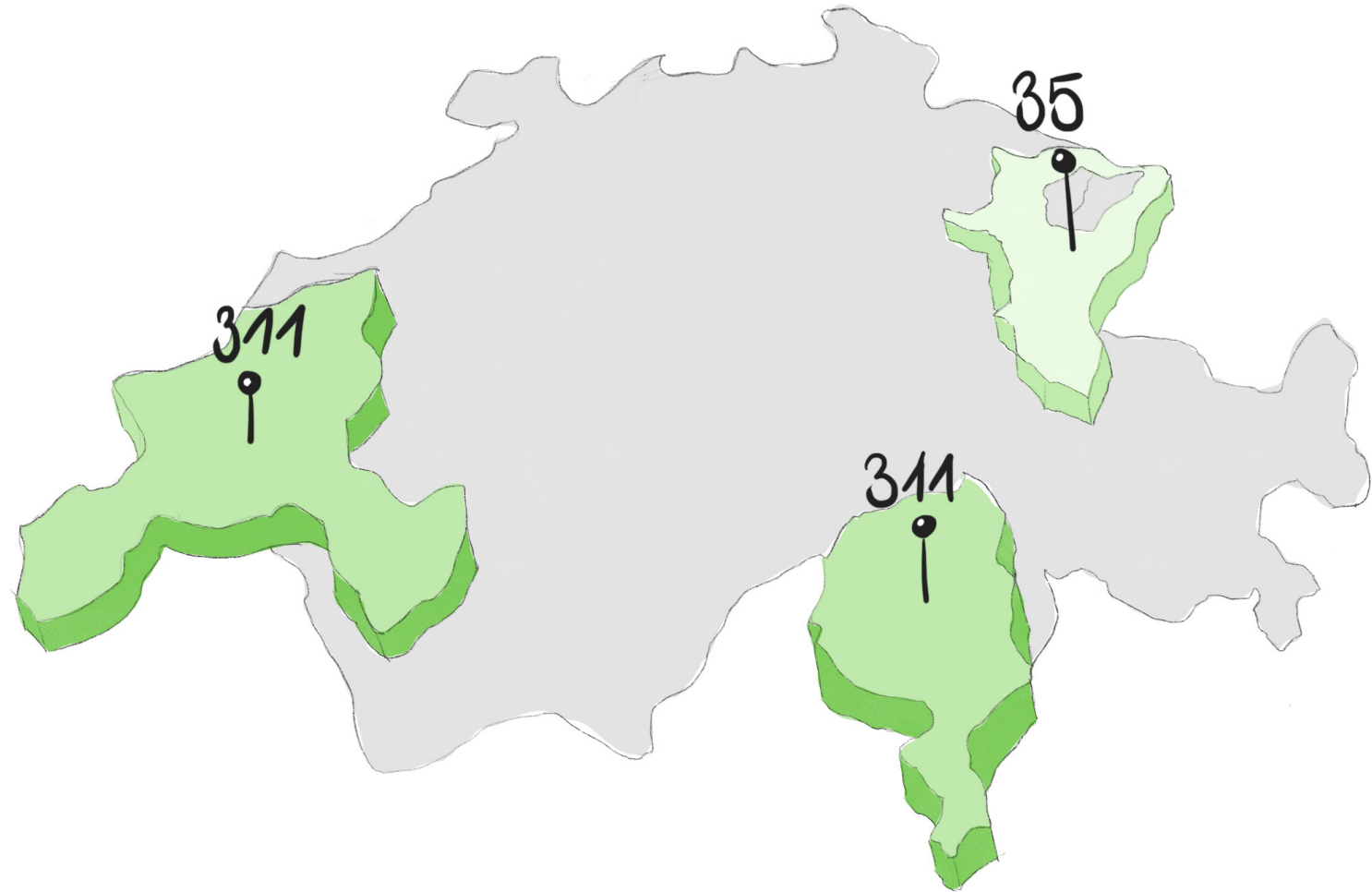

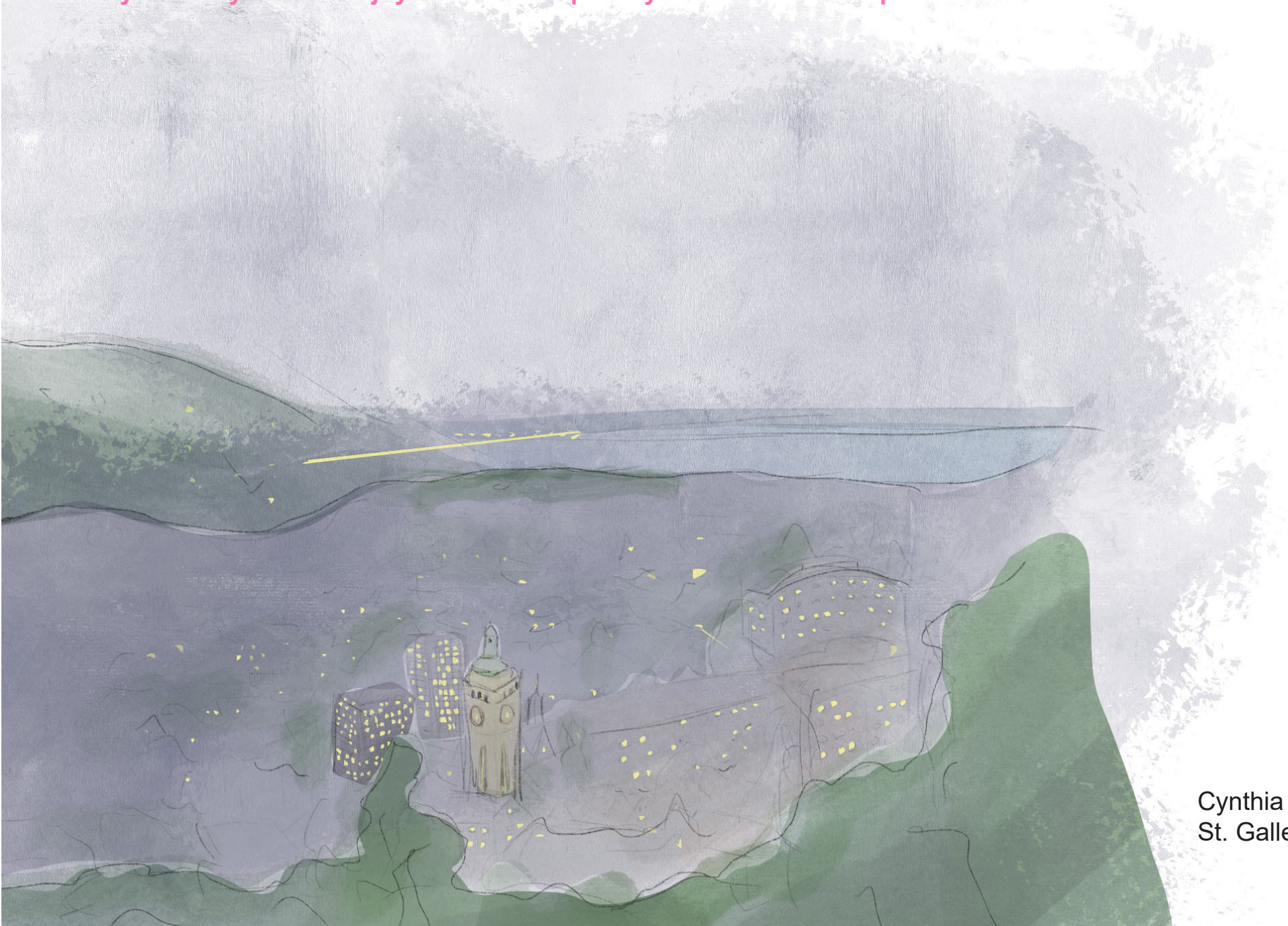
One of the reasons why so many people still go outside to meet friends despite of the danger of an infection, could be the low number of deaths we had in the canton of **St. Gallen**.
