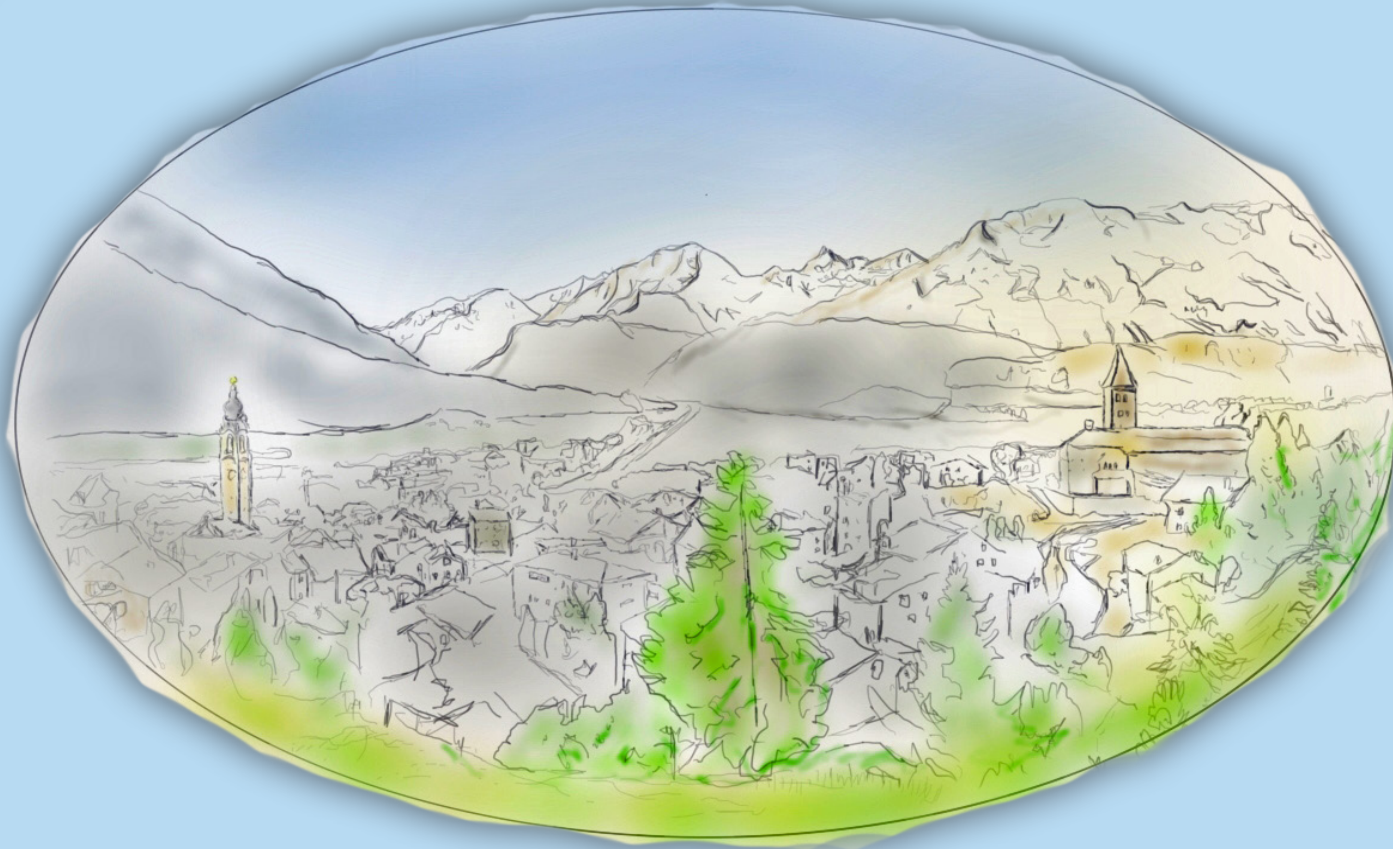
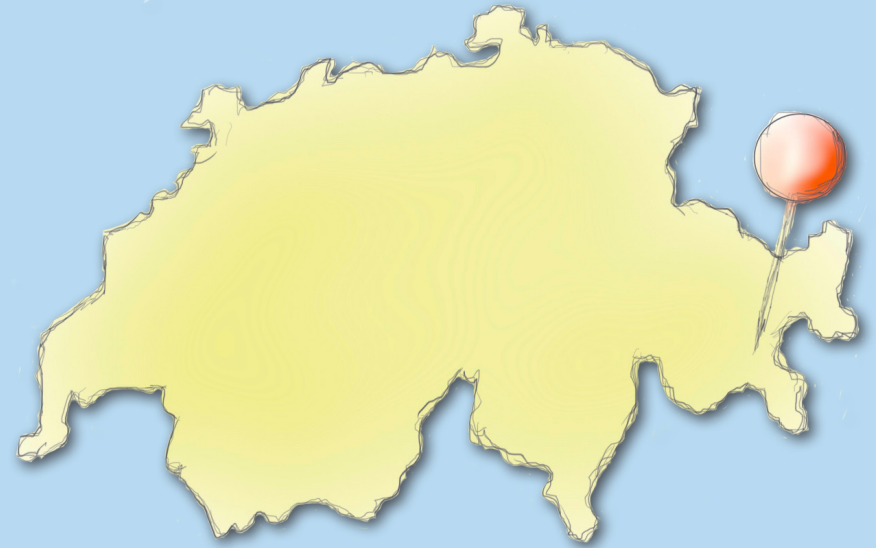

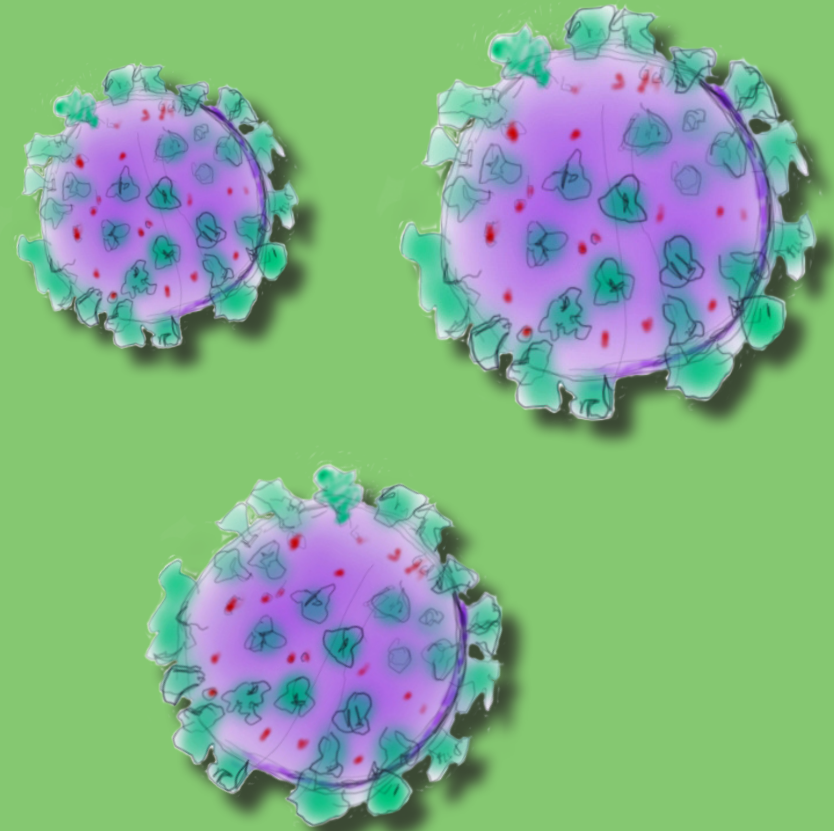
**Samedan is a small town near to St.Moritz in the Engadin-valley.

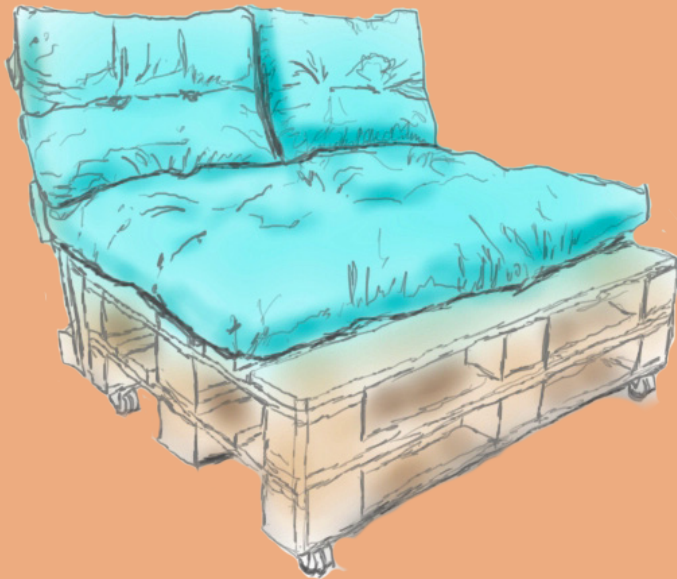
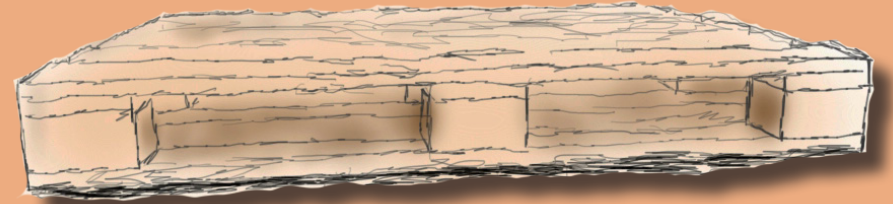
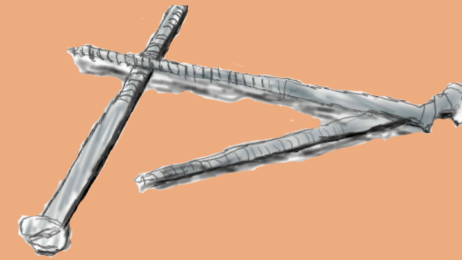
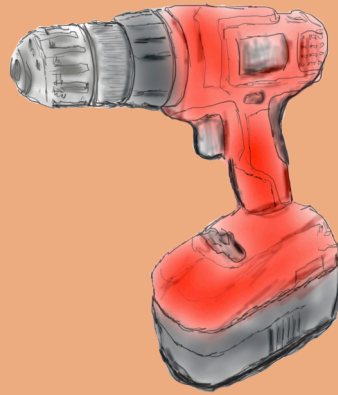


Corina (24) is working on her bachelor-thesis as an architecture-student. During the lockdown she lives at her boyfriend's house, nearby the flat of the family.

their terrace.



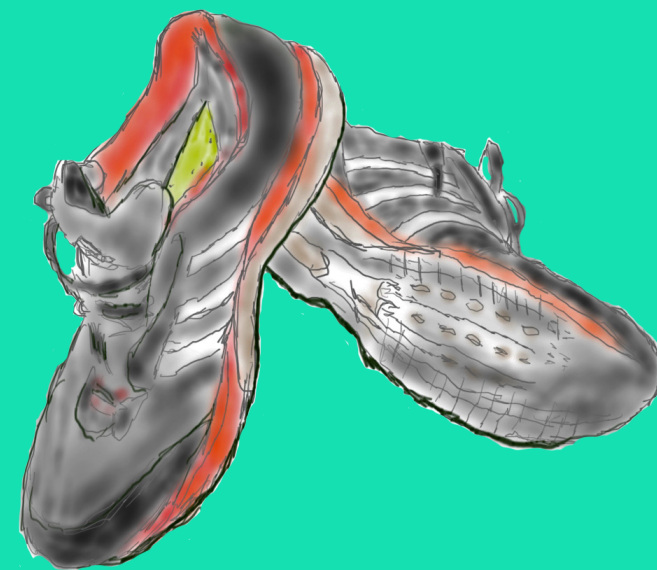

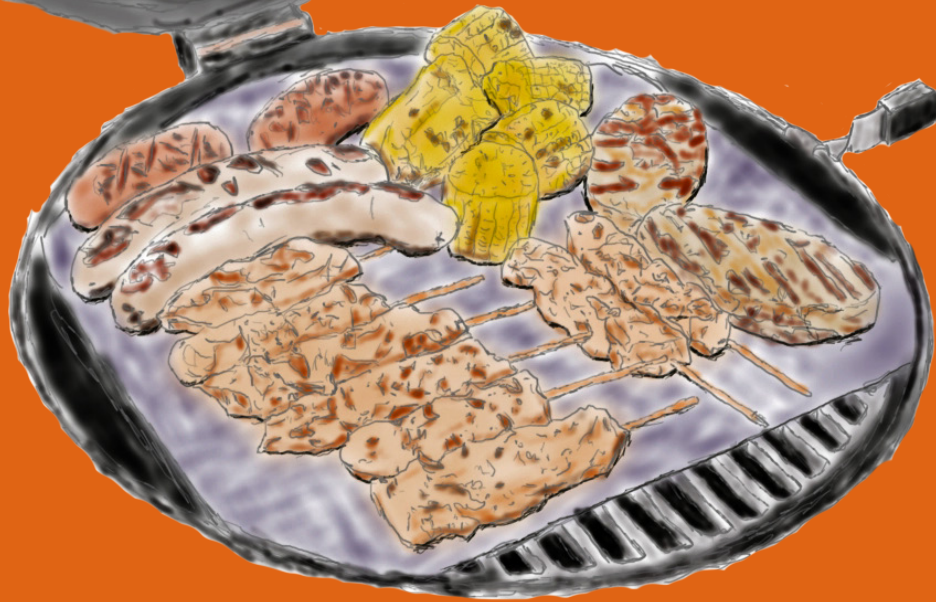
As the days get warmer Marion invests a lot of time in the garden-part of the terrace. Different flowers, herbs and even tomatoes are growing since then.
