life a lot!**



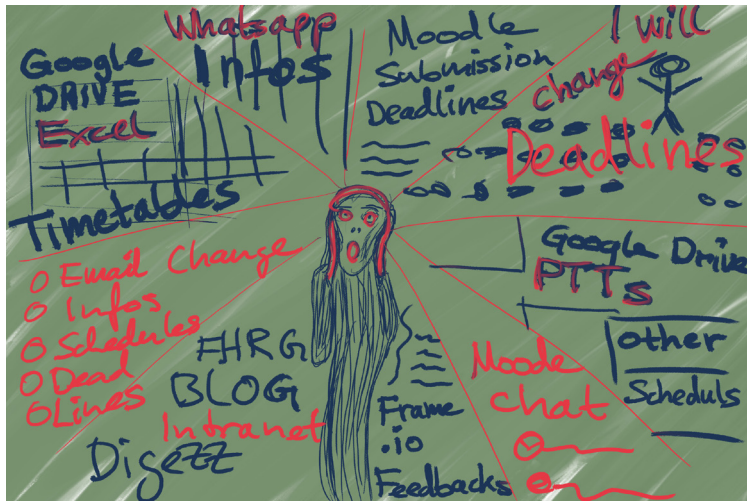

I didn't even realize them anymore consciously, everything was a blur, my world was blurred.

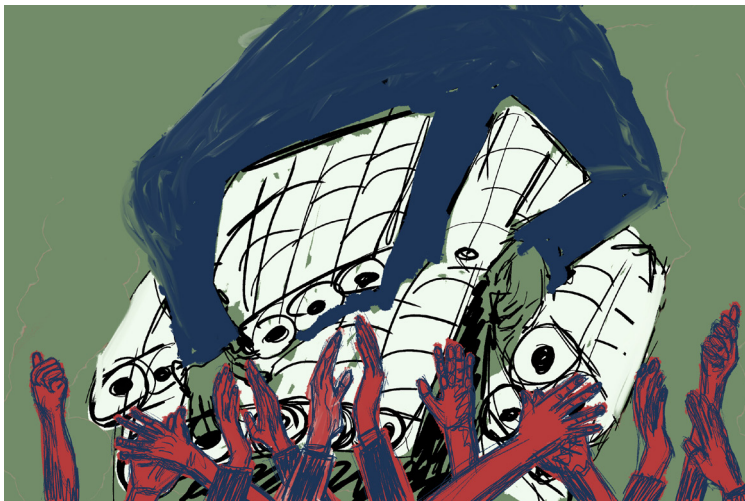

But there was not just only Moodle.

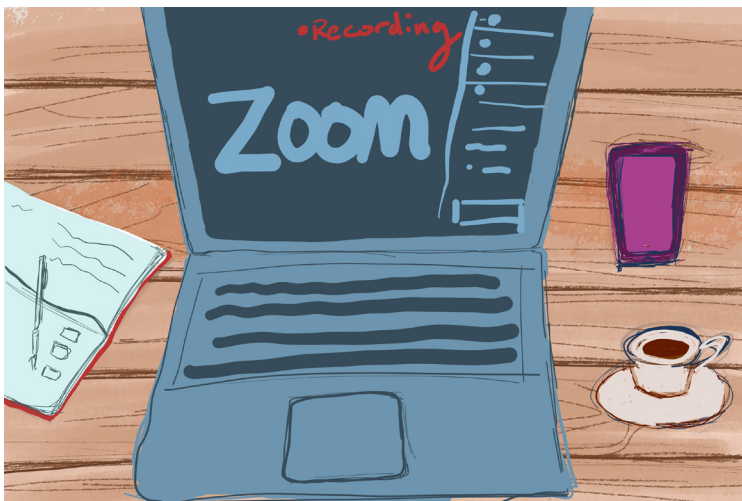

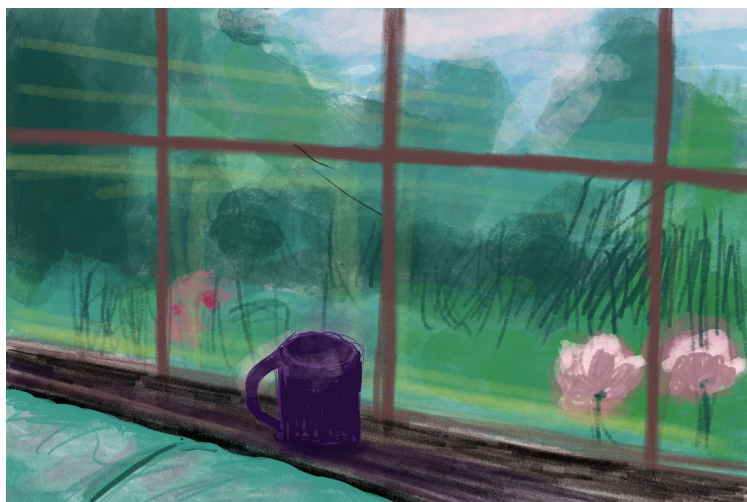
