






Our neighborhood is the paradise for every child. That is one reason my boyfriend and I moved here together with his daughter.


But as a virus known as Covid-19 overrun the world it didn't stop at the gates of our home. Where laughter normally filled the air, there was only silence now.

They could feel our anxiety while we told them to be patient. To wait until everything gets back to normality. But we as adults ourselves had a hard time being patient.


