


In Austria and Germany there is an obligation to wear masks. Therefore, Fiona is prepared with her own mask.

Fiona has no special paper or any clear evidence that her father is very sick. She only has her old German passport and her power to persuasiveness.





On her way to the first stop at the Swiss border.

After a short drive through Austria, Fiona arrives at the border of Germany.


Before the Corona lockdown, you could drive from Austria to Germany without any stop at a customs office.

Fiona's Journey is finished for the moment. She now is capable to nurse her father in Germany.




A few weeks later Fiona needs to drive back to Switzerland for work. Meanwhile, her sister takes care of their father.
